DEFENSE OF PHD DISSERTATIONS IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

In February 2015, CSS and TSU held a defence of PhD theses within the International Relations international PhD programme. The programme was developed and introduced by CSS at Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University, the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, under the framework of the project - Graduate Programs at the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences - funded by Higher Education Support Program of Open Society Institute (OSI HESP).



The head of the IR programme is Professor Neil MacFarlane, Lester B Pearson Professor of International Relations, the University of Oxford. This is the second cohort of young researchers defending their doctorates within the CSS project.
